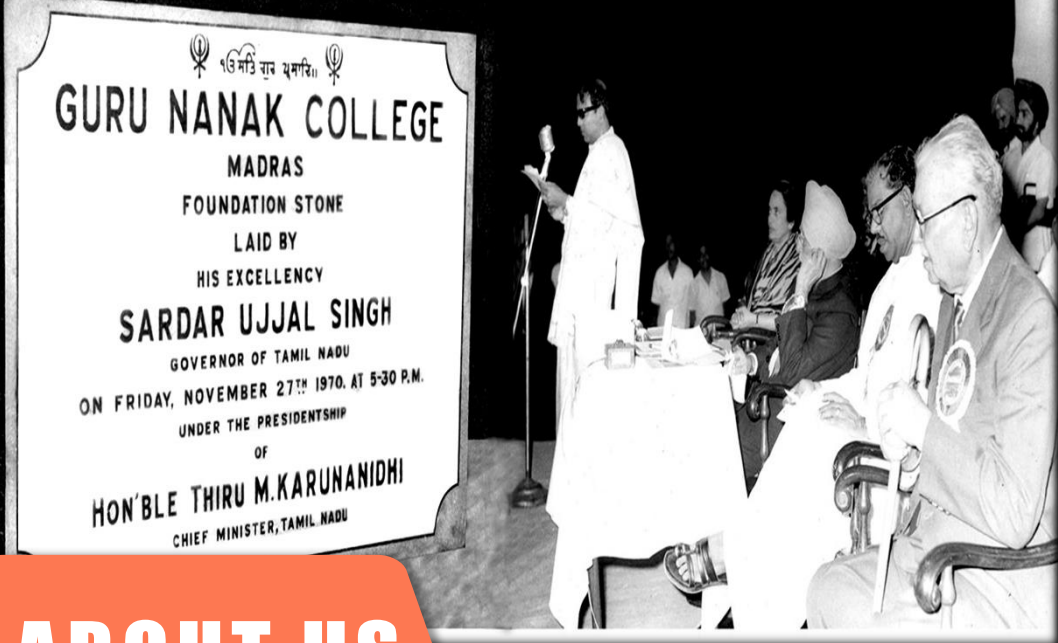

(Late) Lt. Col. G.S. Gill was the founder President, (Late) Padmashree P.N.Dhawan was the General Secretary and (Late) Sardar Manohar Singh Sabherwal was the Treasurer. This yeoman service of a small community of Sikhs, who made Tamil Nadu their home, after they left Punjab following the partition is historic.

Anti-Ragging

Ragging in any form in any place or time will be deemed a serious offence that will warrant severe punishment including expulsion from the college. Compliance of the same is strictly enforced.
