FOOD FOR FRONTLINE WORKERS MEGA FOOD CAMP 2021

- The packing of the food and onward distribution was taken care of by the Commando Force of the Tamil Nadu Police, under the direct supervision of the Additional Director General of Police. The cost of the meals with bottled water worked out to Rs 100 per meal and this worked out to Rs. 3.00 lakhs per day.
- However, the team was very keen to take up this initiative as it was a small way of saying a big Thank You to the Frontline Healthcare and paramedical staff, who were working round the clock to bring succour to the needy patients.

COVID CARE CENTRE

- To provide much needed assistance in view of the growing demand for oxygen beds and medical care in Chennai, a 16- bed Covid Care Centre was set up at the Sports Pavilion Building of the Guru Nanak College Campus on May 30, 2021. In addition to the above projects, the Guru Gobind Singh Block was handed over on May 12, 2021 to the Corporation authorities for management and use as a Covid-19 Quarantine Centre with 380 Beds
- All the beds have been provided with a pipe line oxygen facility with 10 Lpm oxygen concentrators. Individual steam inhalers have been provided. ECG facility and also all basic medicines were procured. The wards have been neatly organised and the entire facility is air-conditioned. All this was made possible by the support of well-wishers of the GNES, who were always a source of strength during any of the Society's social initiatives.
- A special mention with gratitude that 10 Lpm Oxygen Concentrators have been provided by the government of Tamil Nadu. The GNES has appointed 3 Doctors (1 each on an 8-hour duty), one of whom was given residence on Campus.
- Additionally, 9 Nurses (3 each on an 8-hour duty) were also appointed by GNES. The expenses incurred was borne by the GNES.

SWABODINI VOCATIONAL CENTRE FOR SPECIAL CHILDREN

- Swabodhini has started its new centre within Guru Nanak College campus in Velachery
- To encourage self-confidence in children with autism, intellectual disabilities and associated challenges in the age group of 4 to 30.
- Providing special education, occupational therapy, speech therapy, yoga and vocational training to the students depending on their functional ability and age.
- Training in vocational skills preparing students to be mainstreamed into society or to be trained for supported employment.
- The courses are approved by the University of Madras and a few of the special children are employed in the College. Two students have also been appointed in a Govt. posting in the college.



SUCCESS STORIES OF SWABODHINI

- Two students are employed in the college office for a life of dignity. GNC students have also been benefitted by gaining human values such as equality, empathy and care by interacting with them.
- Three (3) students, who have completed the 12 months' course, accredited by Guru Nanak College (Autonomous) have been recruited by Grundfos Pumps India Pvt. Ltd.
- Swabodhini and Grundfos Pumps, a pioneer in employing, Persons with Disabilities (PWD), signed a work order agreement, as a pilot project, to train 4 students, in their factory and the students have commenced their training. This project, is a unique concept of "placing and training", the first of its kind. The students have been offered a stipend of Rs 7500/month.
- RANE Group has come forward to train our students in their manufacturing unit.

GURU NANAK MEDICAL CENTRE

Our General Secretary and Correspondent established Guru Nanak Medical Centre in Sahibzade Block with one Medical Officer and three nurses to attend to the needy and the poor. This centre has a 5 bed in house facility, with all emergency health needs.
