## Seminar on GNC's Vision for Achieving Academic Excellence: NAAC Criteria Wise Analysis

The IQAC of Guru Nanak College organised a seminar on "GNC's Vision for Achieving Academic Excellence: NAAC Criteria Wise Analysis" on 24<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 at Shaheed Baba Deep Singh Auditorium. The programme began with the college prayer rendered by revered Gianiji Satpal Singh. Dr Swati Paliwal, welcomed the gathering and presented a holistic overview of NAAC Assessment. She spoke about the Vision, Mission, Core values of the college, the focus of assessment as well as the process of Assessment and Accreditation. She meticulously outlined the seven criteria and their key indicators that are required for the submission of NAAC Accreditation. She emphasised that our college has the best infrastructure facilities in the entire city of Chennai and Tamil Nadu. The mission of our college is to empower our students to be excellent and responsible citizens. She also lauded the vibrant student council.

**Dr. S. Savithri, Dean (Academics)** and **Dr. J. Vanathi, Deputy Dean Academics,** presented the Criterion I - Curricular Aspects. Curriculum design and development are carried out keeping in mind the global, local, and regional needs. Academic flexibility has enabled us to have more autonomy in our curriculum. We ensure that the syllabus is periodically revised and meets the current demands of industry and society. The feedback system ensures that our future actions are well planned based on the inputs from various sources. Our college offers a total of 34 programmes. The data for all the programmes for five years had been collected and compiled. **Dr. D. Shoba** presented the Curriculum Enrichment, Value-Added Courses, Feedback Analysis Report, and course-wise collaborations and MoUs.

**Dr. P. Lakshmi Devi** talked about the mentor-mentee system and the scope of improvement. She emphasised the significance of mentoring, which helps us track the progress of the students even after their graduation. Students must be made aware of the NAAC assessment terminology. She stressed the importance of e-mail communication between the staff and students on a daily basis. She concluded her presentation by stating, "1GNC with 9 schools and centres of excellence, 38 departments, 1:25 mentor-mentee ratio will definitely attain global acclaim. **Dr. R. Rajini Surendranath** talked about the student centric methods and ICT enabled tools. She highlighted the bridge courses offered by the college to the freshers

every year. **Dr Anitha Malisetty, Joint COE,** briefed about the examination process at GNC. She pointed out that students can use the direct login feature provided by the College to verify their examination status. During the pandemic, Guru Nanak College was the only college to conduct online semester examinations for students as per schedule.

**Dr. J. Jayanthi, Dean Research**, presented criteria III, Research, Innovations, and Extension. She explained in detail, "Why is Criteria III the game changer?" She stated that faculty should encourage the students towards research. Microprojects, GNCIIES, Seed Money Grants, IPR, GNJMDR, and Plagiarism Disciplinary Authority are part of the Innovation Ecosystem in college. She highlighted the programmes related to the Industry Academia Cell and the procedures. **Dr. S. Athilinga Senjith** presented the research publications and awards. Our institution adheres to the code of ethics for research. The faculty members have published research articles in the UGC Care Lists I and II, Scopus, Web of Science, and peer-reviewed journals. **Dr. K. Umadevi,** Dean, GNCIIES, highlighted the extension activities of the college, stressing the importance of social issues and holistic development in students. She highlighted the awards and recognition received from the government and recognised bodies. She indicated that the extension activities accord with the motto of our college, Pro Bono Publico.

Ms. T. Saroja presented an overview of the infrastructure, particularly the lab and its related equipment and instruments, lecture halls, discussion rooms, and computing equipment on campus. Dr. T. Senthil Kumar, Librarian, focused on the nature of ILMS software, namely Autolib, its implementation, and Return on investment. He urged faculty to make effective use of existing library resources and to enhance their individual academic achievements. Dr. D. Ranjith Kumar, Head, Department of Corporate Secretaryship, provided an overviewof the Blockwise Classroom and the institution's information technology policies.

**Dr. V.P. Nedunchezhiyan, Dean, Student Affairs,** shared glimpses of students who benefited from government scholarships and skill development activities. Students were offered guidance for competitive examinations and career counselling. **Mr. C. Rohith Bhat,** Placement Officer, gave an update on the placement data of the students as well as the number of students who went on to pursue higher studies. **Dr. V. Senthil Kumaran** outlined the number of sports and cultural programmes organised and the number of students who receivedsports and cultural awards.

**Dr. T. Avvaikothai**, Head, Department of Commerce presented the Governance, Leadership, and Management of the institution. She also highlighted Financial Management and Resource Mobilization. **Dr. D. Sowmya** delivered a presentation on the GNC's welfare policies and measures. Every year, staff are expected to join at least one professional body. She suggested the establishment of GNC-HRDC under the aegis of IQAC. According to the new regulations of NAAC, FDP must be held for a minimum of 5 days, and any programme for non-teaching staff must be held for a minimum of 2 days. She requested that a single certificate should be provided for such future professional development programmes. She added that schools have to conduct refresher courses for self-financing staff. **Dr. Gayathri Harikumar**, Head, Department of Commerce (Accounting and Finance), spoke about the IQAC and its accomplishments. According to her, IQAC was instrumental in institutionalising quality assurance strategies and processes.

Mrs. R. Rama and Ms. Sukhdeep Sondhi highlighted the institutional values and responsibilities. They emphasised the institution's efforts to promote gender equity, green initiatives, a barrier-free environment, assistive technology, and facilities for challenged people. Dr. M. Kavitha, Assistant Professor of Commerce, presented the mission to upskill employability, entrepreneurship, and self-employment, and outreach projects. In addition to excellent infrastructure, GNC has paved the way for students' professional growth. For the academic year 2020–21, all students were given skill courses pertaining to their domain by the Guru Nanak Centre for Skill Development.

**Dr. M. G. Ragunathan,** Principal, spoke about the extended profile and executive summary of the college.

**Mr. Saumyakanta Sarangi,** Technical Coordinator, IMS gave criteria wise review. He said that there is a scope of GNC getting No.1 A++ college in India. He also urged the staff members, the same practise needs to be maintained as NAAC is a continuous process.

**Dr. C.P. Senthilkumar and Mr. K. Jayaprasad** presented the outreach initiatives, especially the programmes offered by PU-GENES as well as the facilities available.

**Advisor Dr. Marlene Morais,** addressed GNC's Strategic Planning-A Way Forward. She said that in order to achieve excellence, profile management, progression, publications, and

perception are essential. She commended the presentations made by the speakers in the seminar. She lauded that an action "well begun is half done" and expressed her delight that quantitative metrics for NAAC assessment have been completed. It indicates that 70% of the work has been completed. Our management has left no stone unturned. She advised the mentors to keep in touch with the students and track their progress.

The expert panel of judges awarded Dr Lakshmi Devi, Dr Sowmya, and Dr Kavitha the first three prizes for being the best speakers of the day, with Dr Lakshmi Devi taking home the first prize and Dr Sowmya taking home the second prize. Prizes were awarded to each of the other speakers as well. They were judged on the basis of 3 key parameters, namely content, presentation style, and attitude.

General Secretary and Correspondent, Mr. Manjit Singh Nayar gave away mementos to all the speakers at the seminar and to the members of the Guru Nanak Media Centre.



The Controller of Examination Dr. Kumaraguru welcomed the gathering and Dr. Rajini Surenderanath introduced the resource person.









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Report of the International "Partnership and ownership building for sustainable development" December 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019

### **Sustainable development Goals**

The inaugural ceremony began at 10.00 a.m on the 5th of Dec.2019 after a sapling was planted by His Excellency Mr. Kojiro Uchiyama accompanied by The General Secretary and Correspondent, GNES - Mr.Manjit Singh Nayar.

We had the honor of having Mr.Fumio Kitsuki, Secretary General, OISCA International who delivered the introductory address. In his speech, he elaborated on how children and youth are involved in the tree planting. The conference was inaugurated Mr. Kojiro Uchiyama by the lighting of lamp. He spoke about empowering women through education and management during natural disaster. Report on the National Symposium on India- China Strategic Relations: Divergence and Convergence organised by the Department of Defence and Strategic Studies and Research Centre, Guru Nanak College on 27th September 2019.

### **Significance of the Symposium:**

As the changing dynamics of the world is leaning towards the Asian Centric, hence the geostrategic compulsions of India is therefore, to initiate an Informal India China Summit between Honorable Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi ji and the Honorable President of China Mr. Xi Jinping, to be held in Chennai on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Oct 2019. In lieu of the India –China Summit an endeavor may provide an insight to the younger generations to realize the significance of the Summit.

The symposium was organised by the Department of Defence and Strategic Studies and Research Centre with kind permission of our Management and the Principal, at the Baba Deep Singh Auditorium. The Symposium was inaugurated by the Brigadier General Staff (BGS) of the Dakshin Bharat Area, Army Head Quarters, Chennai, as the General Officer Commanding could not come under unavoidable exigency. Mr. Manjit Singh Nayar, the Secretary and Correspondent had felicitated the Chief Guest, Key Note Speaker and Guest of honors. Dr.M.G.Ragunathan, The Principal had welcomed the gathering. Dr.K.Manikandan, HOD and the President of the Organising Committee had highlighted the Theme of the Symposium. After the Key Note Speaker Commodore R.S. Vasan, The Director, Chennai Centre for China Studies and the Chief Guest Address, Dr.V.P.Nedunchezhiyan, the Convener and Organizing Secretary of the National Symposium, had proposed Vote of thanks. The following information are the outcome of the symposium,

- 1. CmdeVasan the Key note speaker had enlightened the audience by the following
  - a. China is having the vision 2035 to reach Technological advancement and in 2050 is the Century of the PRC, the Peoples Republic of China,
  - b. Chinese policy enabled it to have its dominance over the Indo Pacific Region, from Mallacca Strait to Eastern Coast of Africa, dominance over various islands of Paracel, Spartely, Bangladesh, and Sri Lankan

Hambantotta, Coco island of Myanmar were leased for 99 years etc were part of "String of Pearls" grand strategy of China

- c. Convergence areas may include Environmental Issues, Trade and Tariff between India and China, to strengthen the cultural ties between the oldest civilization of India and China.
- d. But the grand strategy of China's like weapons supply to Pakistan by keeping Pakistan as India's checkmate, may be resolved at later stage,
- e. Economically India's constant support to Afghanistan, Mongolia etc is keeping our relationship in a better position in the Asia Pacific Region.

The Chief Guest had given his remarkable speech by highlighting the following factors

- a. While sharing his personal experience in dealing with China , the most difficult problem which they have faced is the Language and communication. Hence both India and China are depending on translators to talk to each other.
- b. China relationship may be explained as Face-off, by which, china seldom prefers to talk on Border issues but ready cooperate for Cultural, Environmental etc.
- c. Govt of India and the Chinese govt are often conduct BPM the Border Personnel Meetings to have better understanding on various issues and
- d. Stressed that Chinese occupied territory of India including part of Kashmir and Arunachal Pradesh may be resolved in near future leaving India to concentrate on other issues with other countries.

The First Technical Session was Chaired by Dr.Utham Kumar Janthangni, the Prof and Head, Department of Defence and Strategic Studeis, University of Madras in which Air Marshall Matheswaran, Retd. former Deputy Chief of Integrated Defence Staff, the founder The Peninsular Foundation, Chennai had delivered Special Address, Gp.Capt Chandrasekar, and Students of Defence and Strategic Studies also had presented their papers. The following points are put forth by resource persons and paper presenters

- a. The India China Border Conflict was fought after violating the India China friendship treaty in 1962, which enabled to encroachment of Arunachal Pradesh, Secondly, the territory ceded by Pakistan to china of a disputed Himalayan border are the main military issues between India and China
- b. There had been a series of violent border incidents after the 1959 Tibetan uprising, when India had granted asylum to the Dalai Lama. India initiated a Forward Policy in which it placed outposts along the border, including several north of the McMahon Line,
- c. Issues like Nuclear power and Nuclear weapon, Cyber and Electronic Warfare, Arming and giving confidence to Pakistan as Chinese Iron Brother, One Belt and One Road enables china as its new silk road etc are the thorn in India China relations. Hence both the leader may have sought solutions to these issues.

The Second Technical Session was chaired and special address given by Capt R,Mishra (Indian Navy), he moderated other paper presenters including Dr.Thanga Rajesh, Asst Prof in M.A Defence and Strategic Studies, Guru Nanak College, Mr. N.Kirubakar, Department of Political Science, Madras Christian College, Chennai and along with other paper presenters from the Defence &Strategic Studies, GNC.The following points are put forth by other resource persons and paper presenters

a. China and India disputes over Maritime issues, Chinese joint naval exercises with Pakistan which enabled Pakistan hopes to get the synergy,

- b. The Fifth generation warfare a Non-Contact Warfare would be the next possible war with china with weapons like UAV, undetectable Ballistic and Cruise Missiles etc by using Big Data, Micro, Classical and Quantum Super computers etc provided an edge over India.
- c. Issues of Doklam, Bhutan, Tibet, Hongkong, etc and its compulsion on India in resolving these issues were discussed.

The Valedictory Session was conducted with the Chief Guest Air Marshall Matheswaran, former Deputy Chief of Integrated Defence Staf and the founder, The Peninsular Foundation, Chennai had delivered his Valedictory address. Dr. V.P.Nedunchezhiyan the Convener and Organizing Secretory had proposed vote of thanks. Entire symposium was Compered by Dr. O. Nirmala, HOD, PG Department of Defence and Strategic Studies, Prof. S.Shoba, Dept of Commerce and Arjun Chakraborty, PG Student of Defence and Strategic Studies. The Symposium was attended by about 600 delegates.

### **Inferences**

- 1. <u>Politically</u>, India being a peace loving country and upholding the principles of Non Interference into the internal affairs of other countries, never interfere into the internal affairs of China with Tibet, Hong Kong etc., while China constantly does in Kashmir, Ladakh, Arunachal Pradesh etc.
- 2. **Economically.** India is helping China in its economic growth by providing consumer market for Chinese products in India, unlike China which prevents other countries products from marketing in China.
  - a. China being an Aged Economy may be able to withstand the expected global recession 2020 amidst of its internal threats.
  - b. The investment made by China on BRI (One Belt and Road Initiative) was standing as its burden on its economy in lieu of recession,
  - c. The trade war between China and USA had reached its saturation limit hence Chinese manufacturing sector has virtually paralyzes China's economy.
  - Hence, China's compulsion is to have a close relationship with India.
- 3. <u>Strategically</u>, Chinese String of Pearls and its bases are established encircling India, and South and Southeast Asian states, Indian Ocean Littorals, etc. This enhances Chinese maintenance cost but doesn't serves its purpose.
- 4. <u>Geo-Strategically</u>, USA was using China as a checkmate to Russia, Pakistan for India and now USA is using India as a checkmate to China.
- 5. **Finally,** The following points were concluded the Symposium,
  - . A new fermentation and combination of India China- Russia a new equation in the international relations would be best answer to protect the interests of all three giants of Asia, besides preventing US influences in Asia Pacific region.
  - a. It may facilitate a joint exploration for Deep Sea Mining in the central Indian Ocean which were given by the UNCLOS III, to both India and China.
  - b. India now may expect china to stop military support to Pakistan, Non Interference into the internal affairs of India.
